## Elections

Before primary, general and any other elections, every registered voter is mailed information about the election and the address of his/her polling place.

**The polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.**

### Who May Register To Vote?

To be eligible to register to vote in Sacramento County or anywhere in California, you must be:

- A United States citizen.
- A resident of California.
- At least 18 years old at the time of the next election.
- Not in prison or on parole for the conviction of a felony.
- You have not been judged by a court to be mentally incompetent to register and vote.

To register, you must complete and sign an Affidavit of Registration and send it to the Registrar of Voters. Postal registration affidavits are available at locations throughout Sacramento County, including: post offices, city halls, fire stations, courthouses, county libraries, Department of Motor Vehicles and Employment Development Offices. Affidavits are preaddressed and have pre-paid postage.

Your registration will be effective 15 days after your properly completed and signed Affidavit of Registration is received by the Registrar of Voters. Registration for any election closes 15 days before election day. If you moved after this date, you can return to your old polling place for that election. A new Affidavit of Registration must be filled out to correct your address for future elections.

To qualify for an absentee ballot, you must:

- Be registered to vote in Sacramento County.
- Live in the district holding the election.
- Submit a signed application to the Registrar of Voters.

Registered voters who expect to be absent from their precinct on election day may apply for an absentee ballot. Applications by mail must be received by the Registrar of Voters by the 7th day prior to the election. Absentee ballots are not available until the 29th day prior to the election. An application for an absentee ballot is included in the election material sent to registered voters prior to an election, which may be completed and mailed to the Registrar of Voters. When applying in person, voters can apply for an absentee ballot up to and throughout election day.

Voter absentee ballots must be received in the Registrar of Voters' Office or at any polling place in Sacramento County by 8:00 p.m. Election Day.

## How Do I Run for Public Office or Place a Measure on the Ballot ?

Voter Registration and Elections publishes a "Candidate's Guide" before each election at which candidates are either nominated or elected to office. There are also various publications prepared by Secretary of State and County of Sacramento to assist in procedures to put a measure on the ballot.
